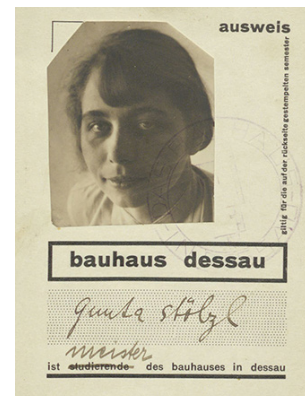
Handspun Ghazni Wool

Stölzl is known for her textiles as well as being the first female master at the Bauhaus and mentor to Anni Albers.

The original artwork was designed in 1922 for serial production and shown at the very first Bauhaus exhibition in 1923, here brought to life in wool and weave.

All rugs are produced with the relevant institution estate or artist, closely involved in the whole process to ensure that the end result is as faithful to the original work as possible, the same as producing a limited edition print.
